Say it Now, Say it Loud!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia!

I know what you're thinking ... Easter came and went back on March 31st ... why is this pastor bringing us old news? Well, the OCD purist in me wants to tell the world that the Resurrection of Our Lord (the official title for Easter Sunday) is not celebrated on just that one Sunday, but fifty consecutive days of Easter rejoicing are ours. The final day of our celebration, as always, will be on the Day of Pentecost which falls on May 19th this year.

Easter-spirit and springtime weather lift our hearts and quicken our steps. The flowers, especially the Easter lilies, brighten our lives. All these things seem natural, connected, and essential to the rhythm of our lives. These things become so natural we begin to take them for granted. Regrettably, some Christians even take Easter (both the "big day" and the season) for granted ... after all, Easter comes every year just as surly as the coming of spring.

But take a minute. Think about just how bold a statement we make by celebrating Easter (both the day and the season). The Roman rulers and the Temple authorities confidently said that Jesus was dead. The laws of mankind had been carried out and the will of the religious leaders had prevailed. All the natural laws confirmed the intent of the leaders' work.

Then God's will became known. By His will the stone was rolled away and Jesus was loose in creation.Truth became known – Jesus is Lord! Jesus lives! God lives and is living among us in the person of Jesus Christ! This reality, this truth, defied the will of the powers of the earth. God's defiance of everything people thought they knew about their world rocked them – it shook them to their core. Even some of those who were closest to Jesus ran from the empty tomb in terror.


Sometimes we fail to appreciate the radical political statement we make when we profess the empty tomb. When we declare Jesus risen and raise our alleluias, we join the witnesses of the resurrection in defiance of "conventional wisdom" – the wisdom of people who presume to be in charge.

Conventional wisdom even in our time says that resurrection is not possible. Many, the majority perhaps, say that God is dead, or Jesus was not the incarnation of God, or that God never existed in the first place. The media presents us with learned talking heads who pronounce Christian belief (and religion in general) a "quaint superstition which has no place in the world of thinking people."

What do we say in response to such things? First, we do not condemn the authors of these statements. Instead, we live the Easter life. We proclaim Christ risen and relate what the original witnesses handed to us. We do our best to live lives in which Jesus truly is Lord and avoid the idolatrous tendency we all have to declare ourselves supreme (thereby raising ourselves to the level of a god). Finally and significantly, we make these proclamations publicly. We do this on Sunday during the Easter season, and we make this bold proclamation every other day of the week as well.

We are Easter people. We have been joined to Jesus' baptism, his death and resurrection, and we now live as God's children. This is the message at the heart of the Easter story. We are the storytellers. Let us love to tell the story, and despite the political voices which have been arrayed against the gospel in every age, let us proclaim loudly: "God is not dead ... He is risen!" Amen.

Also, a quick note to update you on the journey for the well drilling plans for the gift you have given to Friends of Madagascar Mission. We have a plan to work with Madagascar Water Project, a non-profit managed by Fred Rittelmeyer (a retired oil executive and geologist who worked in Madagascar and came back to help the people). In the with his representative in Madagascar in January to agree to a plan for the drilling. They have not been able to move the heavy equipment during the rainy season as the roads are in terrible condition. They had planned to begin drilling in late April but now there is another delay as they wait for a new air compressor to arrive in Madagascar. This piece of equipment is necessary as they are drilling through solid rock to get to the precious source of water beneath the rock. Below is a photo of this compressor. The plan is to begin drilling in June.



I will inform you when the equipment arrives at the well sites and a video will be made for you of the well being dug as a result of your financial and prayer support! Please pray for the safety of the equipment arriving for the workers during the drilling and the people who wait in celebration of having a good source of water!
